Felony Assault of Police Officer Statute VA Code § 18.2-57(C)

- 1. If any person commits an *assault or an assault and battery* against another knowing or having reason to know that such other *person is a law-enforcement officer*
- 2. Such person is guilty of a Class 6 felony
- 3. Upon conviction, the sentence of such person shall include a mandatory minimum term of confinement of six months.

Consequences of Felony Conviction for Assault of a Police Officer

- Imprisonment
 - 6 Month Mandatory sentence
 - Maximum penalty of 5 years in prison
- Right to Vote
- Right to Possess Firearms
- Jury Service
- Housing

2019 Reports for Assault of a Police Officer

- 1,939 reports of assault on police officer
 - 1,588 of the allegations involved no weapons
 - 1,824 of the allegations did not involve any major injury to the police officer

SRO statute

VA Code § 9.1-101

"School resource officer" means a certified law-enforcement officer hired by the local law-enforcement agency to provide law-enforcement and security services to Virginia public elementary and secondary schools

WHY is our pipeline so severe?

Virginia has historically had the highest rate of school-based referrals of students to law enforcement in the nation partially because the law requires referrals.



LAJC Suspended Progress 2018 Report*

- Although Black students make up only 23% of the statewide population, they received 57% of short-term suspensions, 58% of long-term suspensions, and 50% of expulsions. The <u>suspension rate for Black students was 4.5 times higher</u> than the suspension rate for hispanic and white students.




